

Jane's Walk Colchester

Our approach to taking and using photographs

Jane's Walk is an annual walking festival that takes place in Colchester in early May each year. Many photographs are taken informally on the walks, mostly by walk participants themselves, and we enjoy and encourage this, so long as non-intrusive.

Given the nature of the event, they are most often of groups of walkers rather than individuals.



Some of these photographs are published on social media afterwards by way of celebrating the walks, and the best of them form part of an annual online photograph album, with the permission of those who took them.

Occasionally they may also be used for future general promotion of the event.

Note, where volunteers take photographs specifically on behalf of the Jane's Walk team, they are asked to delete these images from their devices after sending them in to our central collection.

We recognise that not everybody wants to be included in photographs, especially where these may be shared online, and that this may particularly be the case where children are involved.

Your walk leader will say something about photographs at the beginning of the walk, but in any event, if you / your family do not wish to be photographed, please let the walk leader know at the outset, so that others on the walk can be aware, and do what they reasonably can to avoid including you in any pictures taken.

We avoid photographs of children when images are chosen for promotional purposes (e.g. in press releases etc), except where this is in the context of larger groups of walkers where children are not the focus of the shot.

If in error, any image is subsequently used in which you or your children are easily identifiable, please contact us and we will take the photo down immediately.
